
Dear All

Richard Murrell: Lead Studio Director of BBC News visits Gateway Academy!

Yr. 9 and 10 Drama, i-Media and Film Students had a visit from Richard Murrell who spoke about his background, career and gave an inspirational message about aspiration. He encouraged students to 'aim higher than you think you can'. He described his upbringing in East London with his father, who was a milkman. He dreamt from a young age of being able to work in broadcasting. He showed numerous clips from his travels whilst working around the world, an insight into his work life and clips from his colleagues describing their experiences. One of the most notable clips was of riot training that presenters have to go through and then a real scene from a presenter at a protest. Alfie Mauldin (Yr. 9) even got a chance to experience life in a presenter's seat reading from autocue. He was excellent and how he kept up with the pace of reading that a presenter is required to read out was beyond me! The final message Richard left the students with was, to listen to your inner voice, be **resilient**, adapt to change quickly and if you want something, go for it!





Year II Visit to Herne Bay, Kent

80 Gateway Academy Year 11 students visited Herne Bay over two days to study coastal management plans. The objective of the visit was to assess whether coastal defences at Herne Bay are effective. The students completed some beach studies as well as a town study where they looked at investments into coastal towns.


Reception African Print Workshop

Year 4 participated in a workshop to help them imagine life in the Stone Age. The workshop was very engaging.




