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MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

Dear Parents and Carers

We are now approaching the final few days of the 2022-2023 academic year and what a successful year it has been. The quality of education and opportunities and experiences we have provided pupils has been the best ever and we are busy planning to make next year even better - our GLC moto is 'Improve Upon Your Best' after-all.

Parent/Carer Support:

We would like to thank you for your support throughout the year for working in partnership with us to ensure the best possible outcomes for your child/children. We have witnessed some fantastic examples whereby parents/carers have worked closely with class teachers to support their child develop their reading fluency, achieve the expected standard in end of year SATs, prepare for the Year 4 multiplication check and learn sounds in preparation for the year 1 phonics screening check, to name some examples. Outcomes and progress for pupils have been at their best when parents/carers have prioritised their child's education and been aspirational for them this includes making sure they attend school every day, on time and ensuring they complete homework.

Attendance and Punctuality:

Since pupils have returned to school from being off due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our whole school attendance has not been what it once was. Whilst there have been some improvements this year, there is still a lot of work to do for the next year - On average, pupils who attend school every day, on time, make better progress with their learning. Please remember:

- Term-time holidays are not permitted or authorised parents/carers who take their child out of school during term-time for a holiday, will receive a fine

- Read by completing the summer reading challenge at the library, using the Oxford Reading Buddy website or by reading a book of choice
- Practise their numbers bonds using Numbots of their Timestables using TT-Rockstars
- Write about their holiday experiences

We look forward to welcoming pupils back to school on Tuesday 5 September 2023 - gates open at 8.20 and pupils are expected to be sat down ready for learning by 8.30.

STAYING SAFE AND HEALTHY PARKING PLEDGE

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At Lansdowne, we operate a "Parking Pledge" with the main aim of keeping our children safe.

We ask that all parents/carers:

 think if their journey could be made in an alternative way to reduce pollution first, such as walking or cycling.

If a car journey is unavoidable we ask that parents/carers:

- avoid parking on Alexandra Road or Dunlop Road Park a little further away and walk the last few minutes to help our community.
- slow down around our school 20 mph is safer for all our children.
- park legally and safely away from our entrance gates, zig zag markings, railings and dropped curves.
- keep off the pavements as these are for pedestrians only.
- · do not obstruct our neighbours driveways or park in disabled bays.
- keep junctions and crossing points clear.
- behave in a polite and courteous manner with our staff, other parents and the parking patrol officers.




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The GLC: all different and all equal

At Lansdowne Primary School we place great importance on good attendance and punctuality. Unfortunately, overall school attendance this year is 93.3% which is significantly below the Academy target of 96%.

We know that a child's attendance has a direct impact on their learning. Those children who are regularly absent from school and regularly late do not achieve their potential and do fall behind in class. Please support the school in this by ensuring that your child attends school regularly and arrives ready to learn.

15 minutes late every day is 10 days lost learning time in a school year!

School- why is it so important?

There is a misconception that missing the odd day at school here and there to celebrate birthdays and days out can't do much harm. But even taking a short amount of time can be a problem. Your child might fall behind in their work and not be able to catch up. If there are gaps in their knowledge they will suffer when school assessment time comes around. There could be other problems too; children who miss school are missing out on the social interactions which affects their ability to make and keep friends and it can dent their confidence to attempt new work and work alongside others.

Holidays and Absence during term time

Please try your best not to book medical treatment or make other appointments in home countries during term time. Extended trips abroad and families not returning promptly at the start of a new term are impacting pupils' attendance and progress.

Absence will not be authorised during term time except in exceptional circumstances. Please ensure that you complete a Leave of Absence Form to request any leave of absence and submit this 4 weeks before the planned absence.

It is very important that all parents and carers understand that children with unauthorised absences, including holidays, and unexplained absences are at risk of receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice from Thurrock County Council (Currently £60 per parent per child)..

We know that you value school and education as much as we do, and would appreciate your support to improve the children's attendance during the next academic year. If there are any issues that are affecting your child's regular attendance then please contact Mrs Davey on 01375 487202 to see what support can be offered.

Last week we had our Nursery Sports Day and enjoyed taking part in our different sports races. We even had a parent race which was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone!








RECEPTION

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

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


